PUBLIC HEARING ON LOCAL LAW #3 PUBLIC PARKING

The Village of Fort Edward Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the public interest to adopt a local law amending the Village's Vehicle and Traffic local law to amend certain no parking areas and other amendments.

Mayor Traver highlighted some specific streets and what the proposed changes would be. The topic focused on Mechanic Street, Roger's Island Road, and Seminary Street.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ginny Henry
42 Mechanic Street

Ginny currently parks across the street from her home, which is now in the proposed change area for no parking. Ginny also mentioned that the tenants at 41 Mechanic will have no where to park due to the landlord refusing to let them park in the driveway at the apartment house. Mayor Traver explained that landlords are required to provide at least 1 ½ parking spots for tenants and once this is adopted and the parking continues in the restricted areas, it will then have to be reported to the PD and action taken accordingly for disobeying the law. Ginny also states that there should be no reason for large, heavy trucks to be coming out of Pickett Drive. Chief Derway explained that area around Pickett Drive has to remain free of parked cars due to emergency vehicles potentially needing to get in our out of that end of the street.

The Board discussed the wording and measurements in the proposed changes along Mechanic, North and South of Seminary. Mayor Traver states further review needs to take place and asked the street department to take more measurements in this area.

Mary questioned Rogers Island Road and people parking at the bend and shining lights all hours of the night. Trustee Carpenter explained that with the new signs "dusk to dawn" no one should be down there at night and trespassers need to be reported.
