#### Summary

### Public Hearing – PFAS Moratorium

#### 1. Open

- The public hearing is a continuation of discussions regarding the moratorium currently in discussion.
- There has been an attempt to solicit independent expertise, but no responses have been received so far.
- The group is considering sending another letter to potential experts to encourage proposals.
- Trustee John Boucher was unable to attend due to personal commitments, impacting the discussion.

## 2. Community Concerns about Pollution

- There are significant concerns regarding corporate pollution and its effects on the community's health.
- The community is worried about the potential for class action lawsuits related to environmental issues.
- Recent legislative changes regarding field spraying and biosolids have been discussed, highlighting ongoing environmental challenges.

## 3. Next Steps for Moratorium

- The group discussed the timeline for scheduling another public hearing, considering the need for proper notice.
- It was agreed to table the public hearing to the July meeting on 7/7/2025 at 6:00 p.m.to allow for more information gathering. A motion was made by Trustee **Carpenter**, seconded by Trustee **Cutler**. All ayes. Motion carried.
- The importance of having a well-informed and ironclad moratorium was emphasized to protect community interests.
