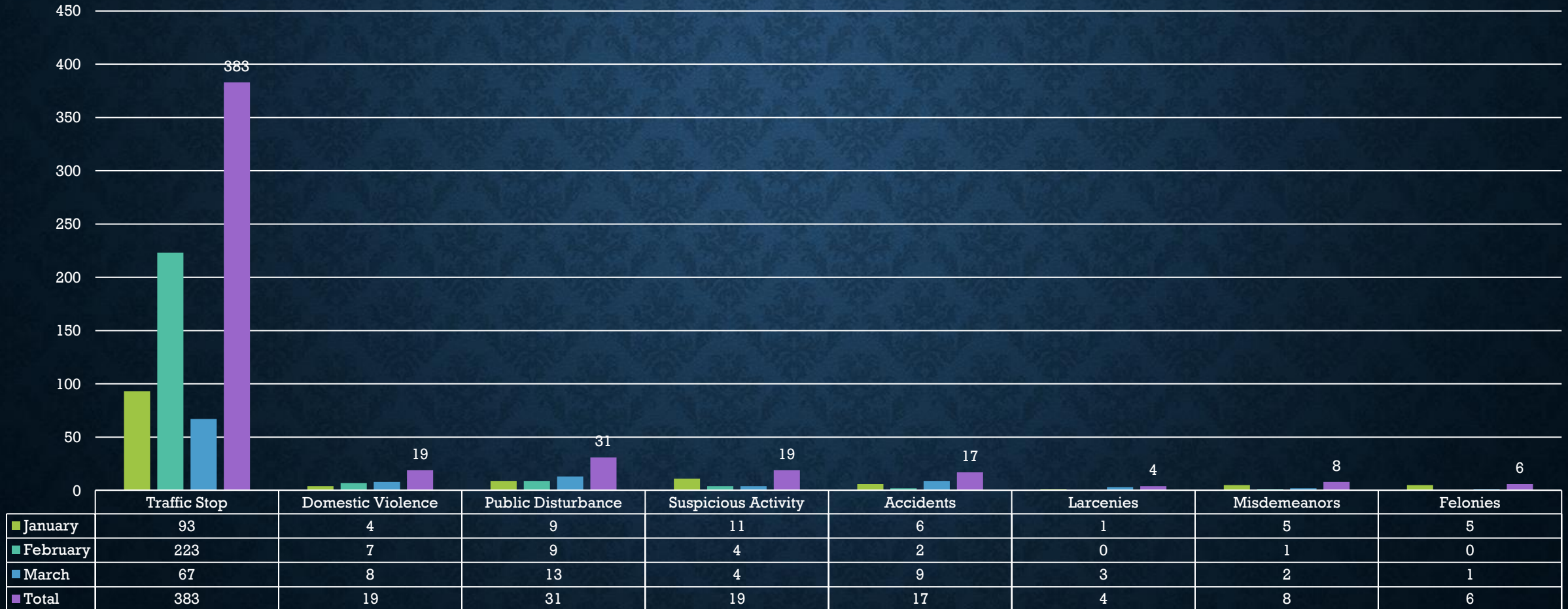

January-March 2024

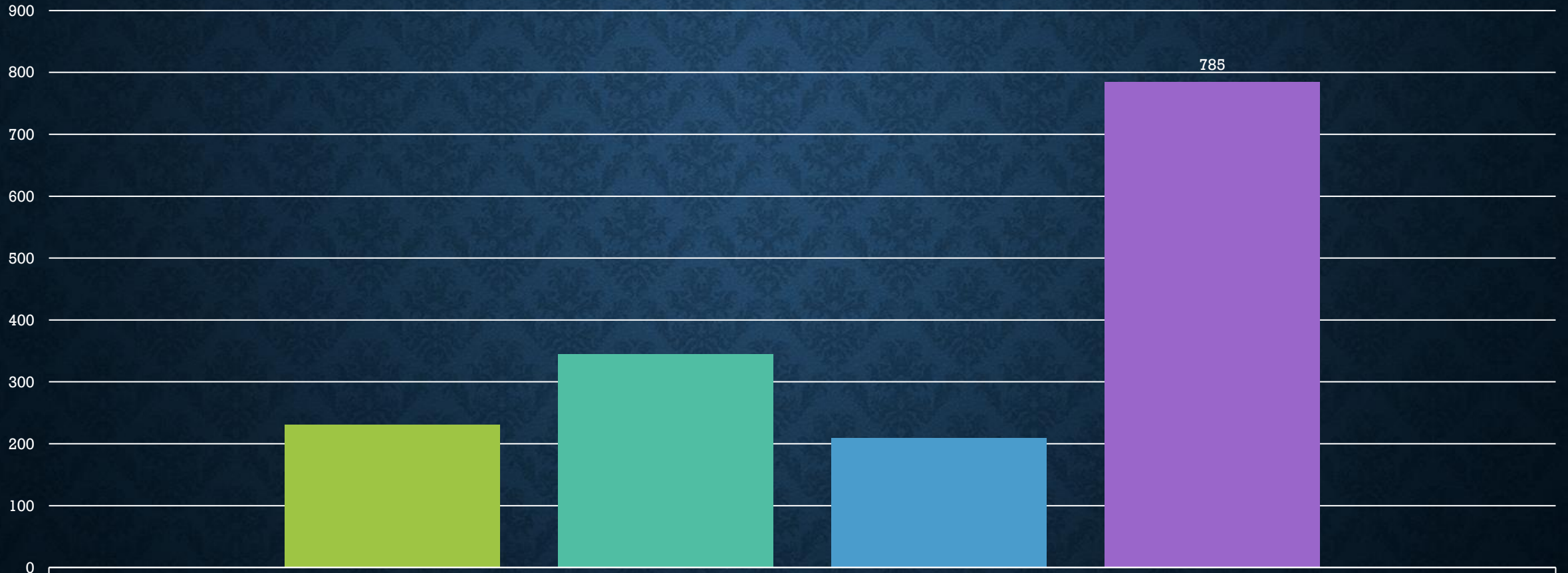

CRIMINAL ARRESTS



JANUARY 2024– MARCH 2024

Arrest Overview

In addition to the 785 calls for service, Patrols made a total of 12 criminal arrests in the Village from January 2024 through March 2024.

These arrests included DWI, harassments, criminal contempt, endangering the welfare of a child, assault, criminal mischiefs, and criminal possession of a controlled substance.



DEDICATED PATROL HOURS

Under the agreement, the Sheriff's Office provides dedicated patrols for 20 hours per day utilizing two ten hour Shifts, 7am-5pm, and 5pm-3am. The gap from 3am-7am is covered by regular patrols not under contract. The County calculates the total hours by multiplying the 20 hours a day by the number of days in the month.

January 31 days x 20 hours per day = 620 contracted hours

February 28 days x 20 hours per day = 560 contracted hours

March 31 days x 20 hours per day = 620 hours contracted hours
